

Summary of Sunday's Sermon/Service

The Power of Gideon – part 2

Last time we looked at the context of the story of Gideon, both within the book of Judges and the Old Testament as a whole. If you would like to watch The Bible Project's summary of the book of Judges (which is worth watching) you can find it on their website at:

I would recommend The Bible Project; I often watch the relevant video when I start reading a particular book in the Bible. There is a video for each book of the Bible and lots of others too.

Anyway Gideon! Do read through Judges chapters 6,7 and 8.

There are two great and very well-known stories about Gideon. They are:

- Gideon testing God with the woollen fleeces
- and second Gideon going into battle with only 300 soldiers.

I wonder if you have ever noticed that this is the second time that Gideon asks God for a sign. Have a read of verse 17 (Chapter 6). You see that he has already asked for a sign which God performed and

then of which we are clearly told that Gideon was convinced (read V22). So why does he ask for more signs? So now that Gideon knows that God is with him, he is strong, brave, courageous, full of power, ready to do whatever God asks him to do. Is that right? Sadly no! Have a look at V27, he does what God asks him in the dead of night when no one is looking! He does this 'because he was afraid of his family and the townspeople' (V27). Don't you think this is a little comforting for us mere mortal! I don't know I always feel brave when God asks me to do something. But you know God always comes through.

I do think that the reason that Gideon asks for the signs with the fleeces, is not to try and see if the word is actually from God but hoping that the request fails and then he need not do what God asks! In other words, he scared and is trying to avoid God's request. I think this is so much like us too. Often, we know God is saying something but actually we don't want to hear or do what he is calling us to do. And let's be honest we are not alone, are we? Look at Jonah, Moses, Jeremiah, Ezekiel to mention just a few, who were all reluctant to do what God called them to!

Gideon seems to learn to trust God though, which is good news. In our second story from Gideon, when God asks him to go into war with only a handful (300) of his soldiers he doesn't ask for a sign (Judges 7:1-21). Yet God being gracious and knowing Gideon inside out (as he does all of us, read through Psalm 139) knows that Gideon is nervous and shows him a way to see that this will work out well and He (God) is with him and in control! I find this so comforting. God knows us and knows what we need when we need it.

You know, the one sad thing about this story is that after all the good that Gideon does and the great statement that he makes in verse 23 he still messes up and all Israel goes back to its old ways! We all need to be so careful and keep putting God right back at the centre of our lives. We do tend to mess up so often, but the good news is that God still wants us back on His righteous path! Hallelujah, Praise God.




Hope you all have a marvellous morning on Sunday celebrating Pentecost either in person or on Zoom.
