

Summary of Sunday's Sermon/Service

Sink or Swim? Genesis 6:9-22

When I decided to choose Noah as my Bible theme I had no idea it was going to be so full of more questions than answers!

God gave instructions to Noah about building an Ark because He was so saddened that His creation was thorough evil. He choose Noah for this task because He deemed Noah to be a man of integrity.

As we all know this was not to be a small project, the Ark was colossal; the length of 1.5 football fields, the height of a modern 4 storey building with enough storage space for 450 semi trailers.

It doesn't say that Noah had any discourse with God, he simply listened and acted, how many of us can say the same thing when God gives us a job to do! There's no mention either of what his family thought!

There's a lot of speculation about how Noah would have embarked on finding all the animals and then making sure there was one of each kind and that there were male and female pairs.

BUT if we believe God gave Noah precise instructions of the materials needed to build the Ark then why isn't it simply possible that God "spoke" to the animals and had them practically queueing up to get in the Ark.

Noah choose a raven first to leave the Ark because ravens are a symbol of God's provision, and of course the dove and an olive leaf symbolise peace.

I also hadn't realised that it was at least another 8 months or so, after landing on Mt Ararat, before Noah's family even got to leave the Ark.


It's a truly remarkable account of God's love for us, and also how He would like us to respond to His requests by listening and obeying.
