As I was preparing the sermon for this week's service – Ezekiel 47, the river flowing from the temple (see below) and as I read Isaiah 6 in preparation, I got to thinking about what it was that Isaiah was particularly concerned about and of course that was his lips – how he used them, or as James puts it in the book of James, in the New Testament how we use our tongues to speak blessings but also curses. This got me thinking; if a great prophet like Isaiah was worried about that, perhaps we should be. Perhaps we need to think about controlling what we say (and perhaps even what we think)?

As Christians we need to be a people who use our tongues for blessing, and only blessing. So often I hear people, especially Christians, bringing people down with what they say, gossiping or being critical about people. You know Jesus, even when he was on the cross, never said anything negative about His crucifiers! He said, "forgive them Lord, for they don't know what they are doing". Wouldn't it be fabulous if Christians were known, rather than what we don't like or think, as people who always lifts other up? In word and deed. I wonder what effect that would have on Church attendance and church growth?

We are told by Jesus to love our enemies and bless those who curse us (Matt 5:44). You know, I don't know that I have any enemies, but I have people who I feel have wronged me and people that I struggle with. I think Jesus is saying we should love these people too and if that is the case we should be speaking blessings into their lives too!

Let's be a church that never speaks negatively into people lives but speaks life, joy, peace and blessings. What do you think?

## Summary of Sunday's Sermon/Service

### The river flowing from the temple. Ezekiel 47:1-12

Rivers and water in general are powerful images in the Bible. They are images of new life and refreshment. And our Ezekiel passage is one of the most popular and well known in the Old Testament, if not the Bible as a whole. The temple is also a powerful image in the Bible, the image of meeting with

God and God being at the centre with His people. The Trouble was, at least in the Old Testament, it was difficult to come into God's presence because God was Holy and humans were generally not, they were unclean and like light and dark or good and bad, they can't be together.

The whole book of Leviticus is summed up by Leviticus 11:44 Be Holy as I am Holy. The idea is that for people to meet with God (in the Temple) they had to be clean, and they became clean by (generally) sacrificing animals. All the rules and regulations are showing the Israelites how to get clean to enable them to enter the temple, enter into God's presence. This was the norm for these Israelite people, even (or especially because) they were God's chosen people. As we move on in the Bible this amazingly changes. Isaiah for example ends up in the temple (in Heaven) and he has not done all that he should have done to ensure that he is clean, and an amazing thing happens. He is terrified because he is unclean, however a Seraphim comes and touches his lips with a burning coal and instead of the coal becoming unclean which is what would normally happen, he becomes clean. So, Isaiah is in the temple and the temple cleans him!

Now as we move on in our Bible and we get to Ezekiel's vision of the river flowing out of the temple, what is happening? The river is cleansing the world and the further it goes from the Temple the stronger the current gets and the more life is growing and being refreshed. Which again is such a wonderful vision of the Temple touching and refreshing the world. And of course, when we move further in our Bibles and get into the New Testament we come to Jesus who becomes the personification of this river being the living water that give life as Jesus touches the unclean in society. The incredible thing here is this is not the end, first Jesus sends out His disciples and then sends out the 72 to be that living water wherever they go and then of course, even that is not the end. Jesus is crucified, goes to glory (after being resurrected) and sends the Holy Spirit on to all His followers which we (and those that have said yes to him) are now living waters themselves, bringing new life to the world around them.



*'He who believes in Me, as the Scripture said, 'From his innermost being  
will flow rivers of living water (John 7:38)*

Of course, the one thing we need to do to bring these living waters to the world around us is be filled with living within ourselves and that ladies and gentlemen is the theme for my next service / sermon on the 8<sup>th</sup> August. For your homework, why not investigate for yourself what the Bible says about living water?



