

Vision, Vision, Vision.

God in the Bible often uses vision(s) to show His people what his plans are, and the visioner's job is to listen to what that vision is and to follow it with everything they have. So that too, is our calling. Over the weeks ahead we are doing this. We have to put a vision document together for the URC (and other funders) to show them what our heart is; what is our vision is for the future of DURC so that we can apply for grants etc for the building work. I think this is really important for us as a church anyway, irrespective of the building work. What I do want to say right at the start of this process, is I want us all to be excited about that vision and the process. Also, a little (or perhaps even a lot!) scared! If we are not excited (and at least a little scared) then we really do need to be thinking about whether this is really for us. Is DURC really our Spiritual home? I love the Story of Esther in the Bible, one of the great quotes in the book is Esther 4:14 when Mordecai makes a statement by asking Esther, 'are you here for such a time as this?' In that same passage Mordecai says that if Esther doesn't stand up and be counted, God's plans will not fail, but they will rise from another place. God's vision will succeed. End of Story.

You know, I don't mind anyone being scared about the vision that God has for Derriford church. That is right and proper, but, and it is a big but, I don't want anyone not to be excited and passionate about the vision.
